



This is a great example of how to trip out a deck. Instead of the usual vertical slat railing that everybody buys from Lowe's, we found some great cast and wrought iron garden grating from a salvage store in Asheville. Not sure where they were from originally but they had the patina of grates that surrounded an old garden for many years. This type of grating is rarely manufactured nowadays.

We cleaned them up and spray painted them black to emphasize the iron work. Then mounted them in decking wood to round out the deck.



The iron is hard to find, but as usual, we have our sources. Or you can supply your own grating if you have something you like. Pictured is a set of two railing sections, measured to fit an existing deck.
